

Councillor Bingham's Motion of 26 September 2017 relevantly included that: "Staff undertake research on how 'dog parks' successfully operate elsewhere in Australia and overseas... in consultation with key stakeholders including... Pittwater Unleashed..."

This brief sample of Case Studies has been prepared by Pittwater Unleashed (holiday reports from members) as an aid to help staff meet this requirement. Conscious of the acute shortage of open green space and funds in NBC, the focus here is on successful operation of dog parks which utilise beach and foreshore areas – areas which other seaboard and foreshore councils have activated at low cost on a shared basis in order to address the broader community need.

Know the signs

A dog exercise area is the signed part of a park, reserve, foreshore or beach where dogs may be exercised off-leash but under effective control.

A dog prohibited area is the signed part of a park, reserve, foreshore or beach where dogs are not permitted. Dogs are also totally prohibited in all children's playground areas and within 200 metres of flagged bathing areas. Dogs must be walked on a leash in all other areas. On the spot fines apply for non-compliance.

You can walk your dog on most Gold Coast beaches but be sure to follow these rules:

- keep your dog on a leash and remember that dogs aren't permitted within 200 metres of flagged areas
- scoop the poop and bin it.

There are also three off-leash dog exercise areas covering over three kilometres of beach:

- The Spit
- Tallebudgera Beach
- · Palm Beach

Dog exercise areas are provided by the City of Gold Coast. These areas are not for the exclusive use of dogs and their owners. They are for the enjoyment of all, so please be considerate of people who may be sharing the area with you and your dog or using the park or beach after you leave.

A permit is required to use a park, reserve, foreshore or beach for other animals, for example a horse.



Dog friendly areas

Council recognises the need and benefits of dog owners and their pets to be able to access and use public open space areas such as parks, reserves, foreshores and beaches. Council also considers other users of these areas too.

There are a number of dog friendly areas available for the enjoyment of pets and their owners that have been provided by Council, however certain conditions/restrictions on their use do apply.

Permitted Areas - Leashed

Dogs are permitted on the following beach areas whilst under effective control of a competent person by way of a leash, cord or chain:

- Oxley Beach, Port Macquarie
- Cathie Beach, Lake Cathie (Molong Street beach access point to Middle Rock)
- Rainbow Beach, Bonny Hills from leash-free access point north to Duchess Creek (for access to leash free area only)
- Grants Beach, North Haven (from Surf Club car park north for a distance of 200m)
- Dunbogan Beach, Dunbogan (from the southern boundary of Kattang Nature Reserve to the Seaview Avenue beach access point).
- Sancrox Reserve


Permitted Areas - Unleashed

Dogs are permitted on these beaches unleashed at any time:

- North Shore Beach from northern end on Corrilla Estate North to Queens Head 4WD access
 point
- North Shore Beach from southern end of Corrilla Estate South to the breakwall
- Rocky Beach, Port Macquarie
- Nobby's Beach, Port Macquarie
- Lighthouse Beach Port Macquarie from Watonga Rocks south to the 4WD beach access point Lake Cathie
- Rainbow Beach, Bonny Hills from Duchess Creek north to Middle Rock
- Spooney's Bay, Bonny Hills
- Grants Beach, North Haven from the northern end of the surf club car park, north to Grants Head
- Washhouse Beach, Dunbogan from the breakwall to the boundary of the Katang Nature Reserve
- Dunbogan Beach, Dunbogan from the Seaview beach access point south to Beach Street access point
- Henry Kendall Reserve, Laurieton, in the fenced dedicated dog park.







The Future of Leash Free Areas

Council acknowledges the need for some park based leash free areas. Over the coming years, Council will allocate park based areas in Port Macquarie, Wauchope and Laurieton where people can exercise their dogs leash free.

As can be seen in the above text, Port Macquarie – Hastings has historically demonstrated a preference for dog exercise areas to be beach areas. This has allowed improved activation of these tick-free public spaces, and left the park areas to be used principally for other things. Council is now addressing the need to make some park areas, in addition to the established beach areas, leash-free.

Dogs on Beaches and Parks

Council has adopted a new Dogs on Beaches and Parks Policy on 28 September 2010 that includes three types of dog access zones these being green, orange and red. The green areas are off-leash, the orange areas are time share access areas and the red areas are dog prohibited (banned) areas.

Rules for Off-Leash Areas

Off-leash areas have been provided as a facility for enjoyment by the community. To improve conditions for users of off-leash areas, Council has included rules of use which can be seen on signage at each off-leash area.

All dogs within the designated off-leash area must be supervised by a person. The person in charge of any dog within this area MUST:

- 1. Be a competent person 16 years of age or over.
- 2. Be able to control the dog (by voice command or other means).
- 3. Carry a bag suitable for dog faeces.
- 4. Remove and place dog faeces in a suitable bag and dispose in an appropriate rubbish bin.
- 5. Not allow restricted breeds, or dogs declared as dangerous, to use this off-leash area.
- 6. Not allow dogs suffering from contagious disease, skin irritation or parasitic infection to use this area.

Note: The owner of the dog is legally responsible if the dog attacks a person or animal.

As well as educating users about expectations, the rules signage is enforceable under the Local Government Act where users act contrary to the signage.

Green Zone: Off-Leash

This zone allows dogs off-leash at all times.

It's important to note that walkway access, carpark and adjoining parks and reserves are **not** part of the off-leash area. Dogs must be kept on leash and under effective control at all times until reaching the designated off-leash area.

Orange Zone: Timed Access

The orange zone is a time sharing zone allowing access on the beach on leash in summer before 9am and after 6pm, and in winter before 9am and after 4pm. Summer is defined as being from September school holidays to ANZAC Day, and winter is the remainder of the year. The orange zone includes all beaches not designated as off-leash (green) or banned areas (red).

Red Zone: Prohibited

The red zone is an area where dogs are prohibited at all times due to sites having sensitive environmental fauna and flora factors, high human population areas or for heritage reasons.

2.7 Park use and recreation

Clarks Point Reserve is well used for a range of passive recreational activities by both the local community and regional visitors. Open grassed areas adjoining the foreshore are popular for picnics, especially during long weekends and the New Years Eve fire works. Walkers, dog owners and amateur fishermen (including clubs / organised groups) use the Reserves on a daily basis. Dogs are currently permitted off leash all day Monday-Friday, and before 9.30am on weekends. Dogs are required to be on leash after 9.30am on weekends.

Glebe Foreshore Parks

Nestled against the Glebe foreshore in the city's west, these 4 parks make up more than 17 hectares of open grasslands, sports fields, adventure playgrounds, wetlands and off-leash areas.

The parks also feature public toilets and bubblers, as well as barbecue and picnic areas. Glebe Foreshore Parks are well serviced by bus and light rail links.

Federal Park

You're spoilt for choice when it comes to venues for sports activities in Federal Park, with a floodlit field perfect for hockey and touch football as well as skateboard ramp open to the public. Your dog will love Federal Park too, with the grass sections off-leash areas at all times. Dogs are also allowed on the field when not in use for sport.

Car parking is available in Chapman Road. Bus and light rail services also travel to the park.

Blackwattle Bay Park

The park includes the Glebe Foreshore Walk, which meanders along Blackwattle Bay. A selection of historical structures dot the area and barbecue and picnic areas are available. The foot of Leichhardt Street features a playground and the park is an off-leash area at all times.



Unless dogs are under effective control of some competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash they are excluded from:

i. Clontarf Reserve between the hours of 10am and 6pm (eastern standard time) and 10am and 8pm eastern summer time) on weekends, school holidays and public holidays.




Yellow boxed area denotes potential new dog exercise area, well clear of the Clontarf swimming enclosure, to be considered as a means to help spread the load experienced at the popular Manly Lagoon dog swimming area. For families who bring their dog to their picnics at Clontarf Reserve, there is currently a need to pack up and relocate to Sandy Bay if they wish to allow the dog to have a splash. This yellow boxed area is instead just a short walk, yet well separated from the picnic and swimming areas.
